How did Mother's Day Start? Anna Jarvis, the founder of modern Mother's Day in the United States, became one of the leading advocates for Mother's Day in Canada. She wanted to commemorate her mother, who was a peace activist and cared for wounded soldiers during the American Civil War. Jarvis' efforts were well received, and the first Mother's Day in Canada was celebrated on May 9th, 1914. It was celebrated by attending church services and wearing a white carnation.

Spring has arrived! This time of the year often brings a sense of starting over. Doaktown and our neighbours are starting over and doing a reset in the way we do our banking.

For many years Scotiabank has served this area and served us well. They have decided to move on and provide banking from urban centers and rely solely on travel or on-line service for rural Canada. Many residents want to remain banking the way they did for decades, understandable, but it is not a reality. Scotiabank is leaving and no other financial institution will move into a rural area to set up shop. A concerned group decided to form a financial institution committee and we were determined to bring a "brick and mortar" bank/credit union to our community. Many contacts were attempted or made and the committee faced outright rejection or no response at all.

Then CIBC reached out to us, and together we developed a plan to bring a new form of banking to the area. CIBC wants to create a model that fits rural Canada and they have proven to be all in - utilizing Doaktown and surrounding area as an example for other small rural communities that have faced the same loss. The Fredericton team has been straightforward, hardworking, and open to the needs of the Village. They are fully supported at their corporate level.

The question many ask is, "how does it look?" This was addressed at a Town Hall meeting on March 18 at the Legion. Then on March 20, CIBC came to Doaktown for their first official business day to begin a new era in banking. They are taking six appointments every Wednesday. To book an appointment call (506) 458-9147 ext. 231 and let them know you are from the Doaktown area.

Participation is simply the only path to success! Eventually through a sound business plan, we will get a "state of the art" ATM and develop new ways to provide all forms of banking. During the month of May, there will be a mobile banking truck on site to assist with deposits and cash. The best way to find out all the details is to book an appointment. As a committee or municipal council, we cannot tell you where or how to bank. However, if you'd like to help your local community and its citizens who struggle with travel or online banking, join us and be part of our solution and our best option.

In closing, it is very normal to be afraid and leery of the unknown, but the best remedy is educate yourself and then decide. My thought is that you will be pleasantly impressed with where we can go with this era of banking!



Learn a Rhyme, Make a Toy & Play Outside

Ever wondered why it makes us feel good when we set our eyes on a long snowy valley, when we walk along the seashore and taste the salt on our lips or when we breath in the fresh air within a deep forest? Ever wondered why when alone in a huge wild space it makes us feel better to establish a bivouac as a place to go from and come back to? Why we tend to gather ourselves under a parasol or a sun tent with food and drink and other things to watch the waves roll in? Or why when we enter the space of a huge park, we hurry to find a spot that we claim as our own for a while, marking it with our picnic basket, blanket, and summer toys?

What we perceive with our eyes, ears, tongue, nose, skin, and our bodies are not simply images, sounds, tastes, flavours, and time and space. All that information is in fact different types of short and long waves of caloric, light, sound, molecular components, and space density that the atmosphere sends our way. This information allows us to know where we are and to identify the situation we are in. When we look at a long valley or the horizon on the sea, we are receiving long waves of light and sounds and that makes us feel good! When we walk within a deep forest, we are breathing air loaded with ozone created by the trees. That makes us feel good too! When we find ourselves in a big, wild space, we perceive an abundance of wave lengths of sounds, lights, odours, matter in the air, density, and pressure, produced by nature's occurring weather system within the ecosystem you are in. The amount of information is disturbing, so we seek shelter to give us time to manage it. Young children are equipped with the same capabilities as adults but growing up




